## **Tiebreaker Notes**

Ties between competitors are decided by best result (best result, then next best, until broken; if finish records are equal in all races then race points are used as an additional tiebreaker criteria).

There were 3 ties in the Group A/B men's classes for the 2009 Eastern Region class champion. The tie between Mark George and Dave Strang in M06 goes to George based on best result. The tie between Per Johansson and Louis Moore in M03 goes to Moore based on best start/finish record. The tie between Kristofer Knauss and Jim Thoman in M02 goes to Thoman based on best result.

M06 (50-55) – tie between Mark George (EA) and David Strang (EA) at 75 points.

Because the competitors did not have finishes in a corresponding set of disciplines for race points comparison, the final tiebreaker condition of best start/finish record was applied, with Louis Moore the winner based on his record of 4 starts and 2 finishes.

Note: The race points formula was designed to normalize relative finish times onto a roughly equal scale independent of discipline, with the scale based at 0 points for the winner and points for other competitors computed relative to the winner's time. Although the cross-discipline equalization usually provides a reasonable approximation of relative closeness for comparison, understand that it can never be a perfectly precise standard. The lower the points, the closer to the winner's time.
