The 2016 Western Region championships were held as a joint event with the FIS Masters Cup races. M06 in the USSA national group B raced in the FIS Masters Group A along with classes M01-M05 of USSA masters group A, with the other men's classes M07-M08 of USSA group B raced along with USSA group D men in the FIS masters Group B.
